

Crabapple Farm Plant List 2020

This is the (pretty much, mostly) complete list of plants that we are offering for sale in 2020.

About our plants:

All of our plants are grown in Certified Organic potting soil. We never use pesticides of any kind. We have strong ethics about sourcing our seed – in addition to saving our own seed for many crops, we prioritize buying seed from small organic seed growers. We do buy some seeds from larger commercial seed catalogs (preferably Certified Organic and Open Pollinated, never treated with pesticides). Occasionally, we are unable to find an Open Pollinated variety of a crop that meets our standards for performance, and choose to go with a hybrid. We refuse to buy seeds with Utility Patents on them, and we don't buy from certain particularly evil multinational conglomerates (like Seminis / Monsanto / Bayer). Which means that we do our research, to find out the source of our seeds (most large seed retailers buy in most of their seeds from other suppliers).

We maintain our own mother stock plants of all of our vegetatively propagated plants.

Some plants are in limited supply, or may only be available for a short period of time.

Descriptions are brief to keep this list manageable, please ask us if you want to know more!

Vegetables in Six Packs are \$4 per pack

Onions “New York Early” - Classic yellow round storage onion.

“Rossa di Milano” - Italian heirloom red storage onion with a flat top.

“Rossa di Toscana” - Flat Italian heirloom red storage onion, cippolini shape but bigger.

“Red Sunset” - Round red storage onion, bred by Turtle Tree seeds in Copake, NY.

“Rossa Lunga di Tropea” - Long red Italian sweet onion, for fresh use not storage.

Scallions “White Spear”

Leeks “King Richard” - Classic early, tall variety

Lettuce Cool Heads Mix – a mix of nice heading varieties for early or late season lettuce.

Oaky Mix – a mix of mainly oakleaf types, for cutting small or heads.

Hot Heads Mix – a mix of varieties that take the summer heat of July and August.

“New Red Fire” - red leaf lettuce, for heads all season or cutting.

“Optima” - tender and delicious butterhead.

“Plato II” - romaine, for all seasons.

Spinach “Butterflay” - excellent non-hybrid variety that is slow to bolt.

Chicory “Clio F1” - a tender and sweet Italian Dandelion / Catalognia type Chicory.

Bok Choi “Shanghai Green” - small green heads

Tatsoi – looks like spinach, related to Bok Choi.

Mizuna – tender asian greens, great in salads or for cooking.

Bekana – a non-heading relative of Napa Cabbage, looks like lettuce, great in salads or for cooking.

Arugula “Astro”

Cilantro “Leisure”

Dill “Greensleeves” - a slow-bolting leafy type.

Basil “Genovese” - classic sweet basil for pesto.

Parsley “Splendid” - Italian flat leaf; “Krausa” - curly

Fennel “Perfection” - for bulb production

Celeriac “Monarch” - makes nice bulbs, or pick stalks and leaves (picking leaves can reduce bulbs)

Chard “Rainbow” - the most beautiful leafy green!

Kale “Vates” - classic green curly kale, short plants, very cold hardy.

“Halbhoher Gruner Krauser” - taller green curly kale, sweeter in summer, not as cold hardy.

“Scarlet” - Red curly kale.

“Lacinato” aka “Toscano” or “Dinosaur” - dark green strap-leaved Italian heirloom.

Russian Mix – more tender leaves are better for salads, very cold hardy.

Collards “Champion” - standard, classic variety.

Broccoli “Piracicaba” - sprouting type for side shoots, stems and leaves. Tastes great even in heat.

“Green Super F1” - Hybrid main head type, large heads, some side shoots.

Cabbage “Tendersweet F1” - large flat summer cabbage, sweet tender leaves best for raw slaws.

“Passat F1” - Medium season length, medium storage length, large heads, good for Sauerkraut.

“Storage #4 F1” - long season, small dense heads, long storage, excellent for 'kraut.

“Amarant” - Non-hybrid red cabbage, medium season, medium storage.

Peas “Mega” Snap Pea – Nice snap pea, medium height plants, best on trellis.

“Oregon Sugar Pod II” Snow Pea – large, sweet snow peas, needs trellis.

Beans “Seychelles” - pole-type green bean.

Cucumbers, Melons, and Squash in 3" pots are \$3 each, four or more are \$2.50 each

Cucumbers *Cucumis sativa*

- "H-19 Little Leaf" - small pickling type, small plants, good disease resistance & productive.
- "Beth Alpha" - thin skinned middle-Eastern type, delicate plant but productive and delicious!
- "Marketmore 76" - classic Slicer type from Cornell, disease resistant and productive.
- "Silver Slicer" - a white/yellow Slicer from Cornell, disease resistant, productive, and delicious!
- "Addis Pickling" - an excellent standard pickling type.
- "Shintokiwa" - long Japanese heirloom variety, thin skin.

Melons "Hearts of Gold" - American-style cantaloupe.

Watermelon "Blacktail Mountain" - Early round red-fleshed watermelon.

Summer Squash & Zucchini

- "Benning's Green Tint" - Heirloom light green Patty Pan. Productive and tasty, large plants.
- "Patisson Golden Marbre" - Heirloom yellow Patty Pan. Tasty fruit, large plants.
- "Success PM" - Powdery Mildew resistant yellow straightneck summer squash.
- "Dark Star" - non-hybrid Zucchini, dark green, excellent productive, healthy plants.
- "Cocozele" - Italian heirloom Zucchini, with light striping and slight ribs.
- "Genovese" - Light green Italian heirloom, similar to middle-eastern type. Productive and tasty.
- "Rheinau Gold" - Golden Zucchini

Winter Squash and Pumpkins

Butternut – Our own strain of the classic butternut.

"Guyette's Buttercup" - Local heirloom buttercup, grown in the Hilltowns for 90 years! Rich orange flesh, sweet and nutty with a smooth texture.

"Black Forest" Kabocha – dark green Kabocha, dry, sweet, nutty flavor.

"Zeppelin Delicata" - our favorite strain of Delicata.

"Sweet REBA Acorn" - Disease resistant Bush Acorn.

"Baby Pam" Pie Pumpkin – small, tasty pie pumpkins.

"Howden" Pumpkin – the classic Jack-o-Lantern type.

"Mara des Bois" - Everbearing variety with great flavor, lots of runners.

"Alexandria" - Everbearing Alpine-type with small, delicious berries, no runners.

"Tarpan" - dark pink flowering everbearing strawberry, produces runners.

"Gasana" -pink flowers, everbearing, few runners.

"Elan" - sweet everbearing strawberry, produces runners.

Hot Peppers

- "Ghost" - a contender for hottest variety of pepper known. Warning!
- "Magnum Habanero" - Productive orange Habanero, very hot!
- "Limon" - small yellow fruit, small plants, very productive, very hot, fruity flavor.
- "Thai Hot" - tiny fruit on a small, compact plant. Ornamental, very hot.
- "Chinese Five Color" - fruit ripen from purple to red through the rainbow. Ornamental, hot.
- "Sarit Gat" - long, yellow, thin-walled fruit, from Kosovo. Tall, productive plants. Hot.
- "Hidalgo Serrano" - medium-small fruit. Hot.
- "Long Red Narrow Cayenne" - classic Cayenne variety. Hot.
- "Jalapeno" - Early strain of the classic hot pepper.
- "Korean" - Thin-walled variety from, yes, Korea. Great for Kimchi, not too hot.
- "Targu Mures" - small, hot-paprika from Transylvania. Productive, tasty, dries well.
- "Gabi Hot Wax" yellow-lime Hungarian pepper, great for pickling or making paprika.
- "Buena Mulata" Long, mild cayenne type, colorful. Heirloom from Baltimore/Philadelphia.
- "Czech Black" - Purple/black, thick-walled fruit, medium-mild heat.
- "Hong Gochu" - Large Korean chile for pickling, fairly mild.
- "Maria Nagy's Transylvanian" - long pointy mild paprika from Romania.
- "Chimayo del Norte" - medium-mild chile, great for drying.
- "Ancho Poblano" - mild Mexican green chile.
- "NuMex Joe E. Parker" Anaheim – mild New Mexican green chile.
- "Shishito" - Japanese variety popular for tapas. No heat when green, get hot as they ripen.

Sweet Peppers

- "Pippin's Golden Honey" - Small, colorful, thin-walled sweet pepper. Heirloom from Philly.
- "Jimmy Nardello's" - Long pointy thin-walled Italian sweet frying pepper. Dries well.
- "Cubanelle" - Lime green frying pepper.
- "Orange Picnic" - small, sweet orange snacking pepper.
- "Stocky Red Roaster" - long Italian type, tall plants.
- "Antohi Romanian" - Thick-walled heart-shaped peppers ripen from yellow to red. Sweet.
- "Purple Beauty" - Purple bell pepper, ripens to red.
- "Golden California Wonder" Green ripening to gold bell pepper.
- "California Wonder" - classic green to red Bell Pepper.
- "Jupiter" Blocky, thick-walled Bell Pepper, larger fruit than Cal. Wonder.

Husk Cherry "Aunt Molly's" - A favorite with children, also called Ground Cherries.

Tomatillo – we have a classic large green strain and a purple-fruited strain, but fruit color can vary.

Eggplant

- "Black Beauty" - classic fat dark Italian type. Large plants.
- "Pingtung Long" - long, pink Japanese type, thin skin, tasty. Small plants.
- "Diamond" - long, black, smaller fruited variety from Russia. Early, most reliable & productive.
- "Rosa Bianca" - large round pink tasty Italian Heirloom. Unreliable in cooler spots.

Cherry Tomatoes

- “Little Prince” *crabapple farm original* Round, red, vigorous & productive.
- “Pink Princess” *crabapple farm original* Pink, super tasty, vigorous & productive.
- “Honeydrop” *crabapple farm original* Golden yellow, sweet, early.
- “Anona's Sunset” *crabapple farm original* Our daughter picked this super sweet bicolor out.
- “Ida Gold” Very early golden large cherry/saladette. Determinate, short season (July).
- “Sweet Cherriette” Early small red, compact dwarf plant great for containers.

Heirloom Tomatoes

- “Red Ponderosa” - very large, delicious, juicy. From the 1800s. Still around because it's good.
- “Super Luscious” - aka “Super Lakota” large juicy red classic tomato.
- “Cosmonaut Volkov” - Russian variety, early, productive, tasty, juicy.
- “Pink Brandywine” - the most popular and famous heirloom. Large pink fruit, potato-leafed.
- “Rose” - flavor rivals Brandywine, heart-shaped pink fruit, productive regular leaf plants.
- “German Red Strawberry” - pink heart-shaped fruit, early, juicy, delicious.
- “Gold Medal” - very sweet, fruity, very large bicolor (gold and red) fruit.
- “Persimmon” - large orange fruit, smooth texture, few seeds, sweet.
- “Cherokee Purple” - green shoulders, dark purple-ish flesh, rich flavor. Delicate fruit.
- “Paul Robeson” - Green shoulders, dark red-black flesh, rich flavor.
- “Black Prince” - medium sized black fruit, rich flavor in an earlier, more productive variety.
- “Aunt Ruby's German Green” - green-ripening, prone to problems, one of the best tasting.

Hybrid Tomatoes

- “Brandywise F1” Resistance to LB, EB, & Sept., crossed to Brandywine! Large red tasty fruit.
- “Summer Sweetheart F1” Same resistance, in a small, saladette type fruit.
- “Damsel F1” Pink brandywine-style fruit, resistant to Late Blight.

New Heirloom-ey Tomatoes

- “Bert” *crabapple farm original* medium-sized, slightly elongated yellow fruit.
- “Ernie” *crabapple farm original* medium, slightly flattened orange fruit, pairs well with Bert.
- “Orange Zebra” *crabapple farm original* medium to large orange striped fruit, lovely and tasty
- “Apricot” *crabapple farm original* yellow, med.-sm., fuzzy, tastier version of “Garden Peach”
- “Zombie” *crabapple farm original* green, purple blush at end, fuzzy, tasty. Med.-sm.
- “Starburst” *crabapple farm original* small sweet fruity bicolor (yellow with red star at heart)

Production Red Tomatoes

- “Bizhiki” bred for hoophouse production, medium-small.
- “Crimson Sprinter” Early, large red slicer with extra lycopene, bred for field production.
- “Siletz” - early Determinate, doesn't need staking. Juicy.
- “Spring King” early Determinate, doesn't need staking, firmer fruit, production persists

Dwarf Tomatoes – small plants, great for containers & small gardens.

- “Dwarf Lemon Ice” Yellow fruit.
- “Dwarf Confetti” Bicolor fruit.
- “Cyril's Choice” small red fruit, from England.

Paste Tomatoes

- “Northampton Italian” Local heirloom, long pointy, few seeds, firm, dry, great rich flavor.
- “Roma” small plum tomatoes, productive, great for canning.
- “Striped Roman” medium plum tomatoes, striped, lovely.
- “Amish Paste” large heart-shaped tomatoes, juicy, tasty, for fresh use & cooking.
- “Red Pear” large pear-shaped Italian heirloom. Firm flesh, rich flavor.

Anise Hyssop *Agastache foeniculum* Sweet leaves for tea, lovely blue flowers for pollinators.

Chives *Allium schoenoprasum*

Garlic Chives *Allium tuberosum*

Lemon Verbena *Aloysia citriodora* Lemon aroma, great in teas. Not hardy here.

French Tarragon *Artemisia dracunculis* Classic french culinary herb. Perennial.

Lemon Grass *Cymbopogon* Tropical grass with lemon aroma, essential for Southeast Asian cuisine.

Lavender *Lavandula angustifolia* For tea, medicine, and cooking. Likes well drained soil & sun.

German Chamomile *Matricaria chamomilla*

Lemon Balm *Melissa officinalis*

Peppermint *Mentha piperita*

Spearmint *Mentha spicata*

Apple Mint *Mentha suaveolens*

Pineapple Mint *Mentha suaveolens*

Nepitella / Mentuccia Romana / Calamint *Nepeta calaminta* – Italian herb uncommon in U.S.

Basil *Ocimum basilicum*

“Genovese” - Classic Italian pesto variety.

“Prospera” - Genovese-type with Basil Downy Mildew resistance

“Obsession” - Compact Italian type with BDM resistance

“Rosie” - Purple sweet basil, very ornamental, similar flavor to other Italian types.

Thai - Distinctive flavor used in Thai cooking.

“Mrs. Burns' Lemon” - Delightful Basil with a lemony flavor.

“Mrihani” - A distinctive type from east Africa (Zanzibar), BDM resistant.

“Opalescent” - lovely new variety from a cross between “Mrihani” and a purple basil.

Tulsi – aka Sacred Basil, delightful in tea, uplifting.

Sweet Marjoram *Origanum majorana* – A sweeter, lighter flavored relative of Oregano. Annual

Zaatar *Origanum syriacum* – Common herb in Middle-Eastern cuisine. Annual here.

Italian Oregano *Origanum x majoricum* – A cross between Oregano and Marjoram, perennial.

Greek Oregano *Origanum vulgare* subs. *hirtum* – Classic herb for pizza. Perennial.

Rose Scented Geranium *Pelargonium capitatum*

“Peppermint” Geranium *Pelargonium tomentosum*

Shiso “Oriana's Tia To” *Perilla frutescens* -

Parsley “Krausa” *Petroselinum crispum* – Standard curly parsley.

“Splendid” - Italian flat-leaf type.

Cuban Oregano / Spanish Thyme *Plectranthus amboinicus* Tropical herb, keep as a house plant.

Rosemary *Rosmarinus officinalis* – Well loved herb from the Mediterranean region.

“Arp” - upright, fine-leaved variety, one of the hardiest varieties (to around 10F)

“Hardy Hill” - Slightly broader leaved, softer, similar in hardiness to “Arp”.

“Tuscan Blue” - lovely Italian variety, broad, lighter leaves, blue flowers in spring.

Garden Sage *Salvia officinalis* – Classic culinary sage. Usually perennial.

Golden Variegated Sage – ornamental selection, used the same in cooking, less hardy.

Tricolor Variegated Sage – ornamental selection, used the same in cooking, less hardy.

Winter Savory *Satureja montana* – Hardy creeping perennial, rich flavor.

Stevia *Stevia rebaudiana* – Leaf is used as a natural, non-caloric sweetener. Annual.

Lemon Thyme *Thymus citriodora* – creeping type with lovely aroma & flavor, perennial.

French Thyme “Provence” *Thymus vulgaris* – Preferred culinary strain of the classic herb, perennial.

Bachelor's Buttons – mixed colors,
Calendula – orange flowers, edible & medicinal.
Celosia, “Ruby Parfait” - pink plumes
Cockscomb – brightly colored “brains”
Purple Coneflower – native perennial, medicinal. Good for pollinators.
Dyer's Coreopsis – native annual, airy mounds covered with bright flowers in yellow to red shades.
Cosmos – tall airy rangy plants with flowers in shades of pink
Dahlia – tall cutting type, assorted colors.
Dianthus, “Velvet 'n Lace” - Dark velvety centers fringed with white.
Dianthus, “Siberian Blues” - low perennial with blue flowers.
California Poppy, “Copper Pot” - Red and orange flowers float above feathery foliage.
Gomphrena, “Strawberry Fields” red ball-shaped flowers are great for drying.
Hardy Hibiscus – up to 5” blossoms on an herbaceous perennial plant.
Gem Marigold Mix – edible tasty flowers, yellow, orange, and red.
French Marigold – classic dwarf marigold, yellow and orange shades.
African Marigold – Tall, cutting marigold. Yellow and orange flowers.
Lobelia, “Nana Crystal Palace” trailing bright blue lobelia.
Mauritanian Malva – Bushy plant with purple flowers. Edible flowers and leaves.
Nasturtiums, “Empress of India” - dwarf with dark foliage and blossoms.
Nasturtiums, “Tall Climbing” - trailing type, mixed colors.
Poppy, “Breadseed Mix” - A mix of culinary types, lovely & tasty!
Poppy, “Large Lavender” - Mostly single, some doubles, lovely.
Rudbeckia, “Sahara” Colorful Black-eyed Susan ranging from yellows to oranges to dusky rose.
Scabiosa, “Black Knight” Dark flowers floating on a tall, airy plant.
Schizanthus “Angel Wings” aka “Poor Man's Orchid” lovely delicate flowers on an airy plant.
Snapdragon, “Defiant Mix” - this strain is mostly darker red shades. Tall, good for cutting.
Strawflower, “Apricot Peach” Excellent dried flower
Sunflower, “Selma Suns” - medium height, multi-headed sunflowers in a range of colors.
Mexican Sunflower – tall bushy plant, makes a good hedge, small golden flowers.
Verbena, “Ideal Florist Mix” lovely low annual, keeps blooming into fall.
Veronica, “Sightseeing Mix” Perennial with colorful spikes in blue, white, and pink.
Viola / Pansy / Johnny Jump Up – our own selection, we are maintaining a few color strains.
Zinnia – mixed colors, our own selection. Tall, good for cutting. Butterflies love it!

Tea, Medicinal and Uncommon Herbs mostly \$4 - \$6 each

Marshmallow *Althaea officinalis* Large plant, lavender flowers. Likes moist soil. Perennial.
Angelica *Angelica anchangelica* Biennial, gets quite large in second year when it blooms.
Dyer's Chamomile *Anthemis tinctoria* Compact perennial with yellow daisy-like flowers.
Arnica *Arnica chamissonis* Creeping perennial with yellow flowers.
Wormwood, Absinthe *Artemisia absinthum* Large, rangy plant with silvery foliage, spreads easily.
Sweet Annie *Artemisia annua* Fern-like foliage is used in dried arrangements for its aroma. Annual.
Astragalus *Astragalus membranaceus* Rangy tap-rooted perennial, like vetch
Calendula "Maya Orange" & "Erfurter" *Calendula officinalis* Orange flowers. Annual.
Gotu Kola *Centella asiatica* Creeping tropical, grow as annual or houseplant. Likes moist soil.
Roman Chamomile *Chamaemelum nobile* – Creeping perennial.
Codonopsis *Codonopsis pilosa* – Delicate vining herbaceous perennial with bell-shaped flowers.
Dragon Head / Moldavian Balm *Dracocephalum moldavicum* – Fast annual with blue flowers, for tea.
Purple Coneflower *Echinacea purpurea* – Native perennial, popular with pollinators.
Lemon Eucalyptus *Eucalyptus citriodora* – Strong aroma, tropical, grow as annual or houseplant.
Licorice *Glycyrrhiza glabra* – The official, European species, that is not reliably hardy here.
Chinese Licorice *Glycyrrhiza uralensis* – May be more hardy than *G. glabra*.
Houttuynia / Fish Mint *Houttuynia cordata* – Spreading, perennial, edible with fishy, lemony flavor.
Hyssop *Hyssopus officinalis* – Blue flowers attract pollinators, mounding perennial.
Motherwort *Leonurus cardiaca* – Tall perennial, spreads easily.
Mayan Mint *Lippia dulcis* – Sweet (like stevia) with herbal flavor, great in tea. Annual or houseplant
Horehound *Marrubium vulgare* – Clumping perennial with fuzzy silvery foliage.
Beebalm *Monarda didyma* – Spreading perennial with pink flowers. For tea and the bees.
Catnip *Nepeta cataria* – Bushy perennial spreads by seed. For tea and cats.
Tulsi / Holy Basil "Rama", "Krishna", "Amrita" *Ocimum tenuiflorum* True Indian Tulsi, small plants.
Vana Tulsi *Ocimum gratissimum* – Tall, vigorous plants. Annual.
Tulsi "Abundant Life" *Ocimum spp.* AKA Kapoor Tulsi, Temperate Tulsi – bushy, vigorous plants, sweet aroma. This is the tulsi most people around here are familiar with.
Oregano "Kent Beauty" *Origanum rotundifolium x O. scabrum* - Ornamental Oregano.
Japanese Indigo *Persicaria tinctoria* - Annual, for dying.
Patchouli *Pogostemon cablin* – Annual or houseplant.
Self Heal *Prunella vulgaris* – Creeping perennial.
Rhodiola *Rhodiola rosea* – Arctic / Alpine perennial – small & slow growing.
Madder *Rubia tinctorum* – Used for dying.
Rue *Ruta graveolens* – Bushy perennial, silvery foliage. "Herb of Grace"
Pineapple Sage *Salvia elegans* – Aromatic leaves, red flowers attract hummingbirds. Annual.
White Sage *Salvia apiana* – Used in smudge sticks. From California, not hardy here.
Red Sage / Dan Shen *Salvia miltiorrhiza* This is the official species used in Chinese Medicine.
Red Sage / Dan Shen Gansu *Salvia przewalskii* Showy blue flowers, used like *S. milti.*, more hardy.
Elderberry *Sambucus canadensis* – Tall bush,
Baikal / Chinese Skullcap *Scutellaria baicalensis* - Tap-rooted perennial, small plant, blue flowers.
Skullcap *Scutellaria laterifolia* - Creeping perennial, this is the official, American species.
Milk Thistle *Silybum marianum* – Spiny ornamental plant, annual can reseed easily.
Spilanthes *Spilanthes oleracea* – Low creeping annual, flowers look like eyeballs. "Toothache Plant."
Wood Betony *Stachys officinalis* – Upright clumping perennial, purple flowers.
Feverfew *Tanacetum parthenium* – Clumping perennial, small daisy-like flowers.
Valerian *Valeriana officinalis* – Tall perennial, white flowers attract pollinators.
Ashwagandha *Withania somnifera* – Bushy annual, related to eggplant and husk cherries.
